- <u>Four-fold concept of competences development</u>: developing sensitivity and awareness, knowledge and understanding, individual practice, societal practice

Teachers of all subjects from primary school to upper seconday school (6-19)

- reporting, follow-up and dissemination after the seminar.

Participants must be able to sustain professional communication in the working language of the seminar, being English.

10. Focus of the training activity:

What will schools in 2032 look like and what will be their main functions? A balance between education for economic growth and education for a democratic culture of living together in a world of diversity. How has the role of the teacher evolved over the past decades and what will teachers be like in 2032? What are the competences they are likely to need in order to fulfil their function 20 years from now? And will this be the same as it is now and has been for decades? Will the facilitator of learning replace the teacher?

The seminar will look at current educational practice and challenges, identify indicators and drivers of future developments and look in details at the implications this may and will have for the role of teachers twenty years from now and in particular at the values, attitudes, skills and knowledge these teachers will need.

11. Expected results:

After the seminar, the participants will:

- have exchanged the latest developments and trends with regard to the role of teachers and their current challenges across Europe
- have a clearer idea about the possible developments of education and schooling in the coming two decades
- become aware of the implications these changes are likely to have on the role and function of the teacher
- be prepared to develop the attitudes, skills and knowledge they will need to successfully fulfill their evolving role
- > be in a position to continue networking with like-minded education professionals across Europe
